# From Mannahatta to Visionmaker: Exploring the geography of urban sustainability in New York City

Eric Sanderson is a Senior Conservation Ecologist at the Wildlife Conservation Society in the Bronx. He is a best-selling author, an ecosystem and landscape ecologist and a conservation innovator. He is the author of Mannahatta: A Natural History of New York City (2009) and Terra Nova: The New World After Oil, Cars, and Suburbs (2013); editor of three contributed volumes, and author of numerous peer-reviewed scientific articles related to conservation. He is co-inventor of Visionmaker.nyc, a free, Internet-based, ecological democracy tool for the public to imagine and share alternatives for New York City neighborhoods. Sanderson's work has been featured in the New York Times, National Geographic, NPR, The New Yorker, Der Spiegel, El Pais, the CBC, BBC and other media outlets, and he teaches at New York University and Columbia University. He holds a Ph.D. in ecosystem and landscape ecology (1998) and a Bachelors in Arts and Science in Biochemistry and English literature (1989), both from the University of California, Davis.
