Eric Sanderson is a Senior Conservation Ecologist at the Wildlife Conservation Society in the Bronx. He is a best-selling author, an ecosystem and landscape ecologist and a conservation innovator. He is the author of *Mannahatta: A Natural History of New York City* (2009) and *Terra Nova: The New World After Oil, Cars, and Suburbs* (2013); editor of three contributed volumes, and author of numerous peer-reviewed scientific articles related to conservation. He is co-inventor of *Visionmaker.nyc*, a free, Internet-based, ecological democracy tool for the public to imagine and share alternatives for New York City neighborhoods. Sanderson's work has been featured in the *New York Times*, *National Geographic*, *NPR*, *The New Yorker*, *Der Spiegel*, *El Pais*, the *CBC*, *BBC* and other media outlets, and he teaches at New York University and Columbia University. He holds a Ph.D. in ecosystem and landscape ecology (1998) and a Bachelors in Arts and Science in Biochemistry and English literature (1989), both from the University of California, Davis.
